

Anand Jeyasekharan is a medical oncologist at the National University Hospital Singapore, with an interest in lymphoma therapeutics and genomic instability. He obtained his undergraduate medical degree from Christian Medical College Vellore, India in 2003. He then received a Gates Cambridge Scholarship towards a PhD in Oncology (2008) at the University of Cambridge UK (Gonville and Caius College), under the mentorship of Prof. Ashok Venkitaraman. During his PhD and post-doctoral fellowship in Cambridge as a Junior Research Fellow (Wolfson), he worked on the BRCA2 tumour suppressor and related proteins using methods in live cell imaging and fluorescence microscopy. He joined the National University Hospital Singapore in 2010 to complete his training in Internal Medicine and Medical Oncology. Anand now holds a joint appointment at the Cancer Science Institute, where his laboratory works on understanding DNA repair defects in cancer, and their application in clinical oncology.
